EAP100: English Assessment and Placement results will be used to determine the appropriate English course that matches the student's current skill level. The English assessment consists of an oral fluency assessment and a written component. The oral fluency assessment will consist of specific questions asked to determine level (10–15 minutes). The writing assessment allows one hour for the student to write a five paragraph essay.
