## History

West Park Healthcare Centre was founded by philanthropist Sir William Gage and the National Sanitarium Association on September 2, 1904 as the *Toronto Free Hospital for the Consumptive Poor*. It was one of the first centres in Canada devoted to treating patients with advanced cases of tuberculosis (TB).

Today, West Park is known as the regional adult rehabilitation centre for the western Greater Toronto Area and a local provider of complex continuing and long-term care. West Park is home to Ontario's only inpatient TB unit and has become internationally renowned for its expertise in respiratory and physical medicine.

## Core Programs

### 1. Rehabilitation and Community Living

The Rehabilitation and Community Living Program represents a continuum of rehabilitation services.

The Rehabilitation services facilitate a progressive, goal-oriented, time-limited rehabilitation process enabling individuals with impairment to identify and reach their optimal mental, physical, cognitive and/or social functioning level. Rehabilitation services consist of in-patient and out-patient services, including assessment and follow-up clinics, as well as a day hospital.

The Community Living services provide clients with the information, skills and life experience necessary to live independently in the community. Transitional programs aimed at empowering individuals through their achievement or improvements in activities of daily living are the focus of two services.

\* Rehab Plus is West Park's rehabilitation and wellness clinic. It is globally funded for outpatient rehabilitation and wellness services and also provides occupational therapy, physiotherapy and speech language pathology on a fee for service basis.

### 2. Complex Continuing Care

The Complex Continuing Care Program serves individuals with chronic illness that is medically complex but medically stable, whose condition requires a highly specialized hospital stay, regular on-site physician care and assessment and active case management by specialized staff. The program consists of a continuum of in-patient and out-patient services.

### 3. Long-Term Care

On January 14, 2002, West Park Healthcare Centre admitted the first residents to its 200-bed long-term care centre. West Park owns the facility and its operating licence and has contracted with Extencare (Canada) Inc. (which has 30 years of operating expertise) to manage the centre, including providing the staff.

The long-term care centre is located on the West Park Healthcare Centre campus, adjacent to the Ruddy and Gage buildings, in a park-like and accessible setting. It offers the benefit of West Park's medical diagnostic services and features staff who are responsive to a diverse range of cultural needs, as well as a variety of recreational and leisure programs. Admissions are managed by the Toronto Central Community Care Access Centre.
